Mount Vernon Families and Staff:

The purpose of this letter is to share that a student at Mount Vernon High School has recently tested positive for COVID-19. The District has been working closely with local public health officials to assist with contact tracing related to this case. The student and the family are following guidelines put forth by Linn County Public Health. Based on the contact tracing for this student, any close contacts are currently quarantining at home. **Again, if you have not been contacted, your child is not a close contact to the student who has tested positive.**

As I shared earlier, when we become aware of a positive case involving a student or staff member, we immediately contact Linn County Public Health for guidance. Contact tracing is then completed; with the tracing going back forty eight hours from the time of symptoms being evident, or a positive test result reported. For this latest case, contact tracing was completed for the forty eight hours prior to the report of symptoms. Again; each situation is unique, and the partnership between the District and Linn County Public Health continues to be positive.

You are receiving this communication because we are committed to remaining transparent with you and making you aware of the situation immediately so you have an increased awareness and can respond accordingly. Upon the advice of local public health officials, we ask that parents/guardians continue to monitor their student's health; that employees continue to monitor their own health; and that every individual remain home if they exhibit any of the symptoms associated with COVID-19, including fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, and any other symptoms identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) set out at <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html>.

Thanks again for your assistance and support, including completing the recent surveys sent to you regarding student learning in the hybrid and remote models of learning.
